
#### Maintenance & Storage: Equipment Storage

# Minimize the risk of cross-contamination:

- Store brushes, squeegees & mops head down
- Equipment should be at least \*20 inches above floor height
- Store equipment with heads distant from other equipment handles
- Store clean & dirty equipment separately
- Clean racks & boards regularly


Maintenance & Storage: What to Avoid!!

- Brushes dripping
  - Stacked buckets
- 3 Bi
  - Brushes touching handles
  - Brush in bucket
  - 5) Tools stored in liquid



### Maintenance & Storage: Equipment Storage

- minimize product damage
- minimize trips
- minimize cross-contamination
- improve efficacy and assurance provide a place for equipment to be stored and found when needed
